Learn response actions to consider during incidents of mass violence.

While this class has traditionally focused on health care responses to violent events, this special version will address key considerations for response in crowded environments, public spaces and areas open to pedestrian foot traffic. It will be based on concepts from the Avoid, Deny, Defend curriculum as defined by Advanced Law Enforce Rapid Response Training (ALERTT) and will include a hands-on "Stop the Bleed" workshop.

11:30 a.m. Emotional safety (quality quick topics)

We prioritize emotional safety at the same level as physical safety. This will be extremely important as we potentially see international patients. Come learn how we provide an emotionally safe health care experience for patients and their families, by incorporating developmentally appropriate, family-centered, culture-centered, trauma-informed and atraumatic practices into our daily work.

1 p.m. Human trafficking

The human trafficking awareness course defines trafficking and identifies potential concerns within our communities and clinical practices. You'll also learn what to do if you suspect someone is involved in a trafficking situation.

2 p.m. De-escalation

This training offers practical strategies for verbal de-escalation to help staff members respond appropriately to a person in crisis. You'll learn verbal and physical de-escalation tactics, violence diversion methods and basic crisis intervention concepts. The class includes information on how to recognize non-verbal stress indicators during interactions where language barriers or environmental factors may prevent effective verbal communication.

3 p.m. Situational awareness

This course will teach the application of basic situational awareness concepts, both at work and in other settings. You'll learn how to maintain effective awareness in crowded environments, as well as preventive actions to take prior to attending large social events. The class also provides tools to help recognize behaviors that contradict environmental baselines; a tactic used to identify abnormalities in certain environments.
